Ukraine in Europe: The Lisbon Council Pushes Forward on All Fronts

As war in Ukraine entered its second year, the Lisbon Council stepped up its support for and collaboration with the 43 million-citizen country. Ukraine - and the Ukrainian Government - were invited to join high-level consortia as full partners, bringing their astonishing expertise in digital government and smart cities into the heart of Europe. President Paul Hofheinz visited Kyiv and Bucha, where he met with senior officials including Vice Prime Minister Mykhailo Fedorov, Bucha Mayor Anatoliy Fedoruk, UNIT. City Innovation Park Partner Kirill Bondar and many others. While in Kyiv, President Hofheinz signed a memorandum of understanding with Vice Prime Minister Fedorov, inviting Ukraine to participate in the Govtech4all consortium and to showcase Diia, the "state in a smartphone," at The 2023 Digital Government Summit (see page 2 for more). New Horizons: Driving Debate with Research and Analysis

The work programme and budget of the Lisbon Council have doubled since 2019 thanks to the hard work of the team and the immense success the think tank has had in competitive research tenders and grants. The Lisbon Council now leads or participates in more than 20 international research initiatives, which explore such pressing policy areas as data governance, air quality and STEM education.

Among the flagship projects are **Ethical Technology Adoption in Public Administration Services (ETAPAS)**, an eight-country, 14-partner consortium where the Lisbon Council leads a work package on governance and risk; **Surrounded by Science**, a seven-partner coalition that evaluates out-of-the-school-system science projects for effectiveness and impact; and **SALL: Schools as Living Labs**, a 10-member consortium which is writing a roadmap covering new ways to teach science and deepen local-community roots in the education system. The projects are cofinanced by the European Union.

Top digital government experts from 14 countries joined The 2023 Digital Government Summit in Brussels, including Ukraine Vice Prime Minister Mykhailo Fedorov, who left the barricaded government-office compound in Kyiv to meet leading members of the Govtech4all consortium, which Ukraine recently joined, and deliver his first in-person Brussels keynote. In the presence of the vice prime minister, the 21 coalition partners endorsed the Govtech4all consortium agreement on stage – using the Diia app's unique "blink" signature. Also keynoting was Johannes Hahn, commissioner for budget and administration, who presented the Interoperable Europe Act, a recent European Commission proposal. Other speakers included Mark Boris Andrijanič, former minister of digital transformation (Slovenia); Luukas K. Energy and Sustainability: A Campaign on Many Fronts

The Lisbon Council continues to develop expertise and build communities around the ongoing energy transition – and the role that digital technology and startups might play in it. The Lisbon Council teamed up with Amazon Web Services (AWS) for the **High-Level Summit on Powering the Twin Transition**. Eva Maydell and Jörgen Warborn, members of the European Parliament and founding members of the European People's Party (EPP) Group's Al for Sustainability Initiative; Vincent Berruto, head of unit for innovation, research, digitalisation and competitiveness, directorate-general for energy, European Commission; and Diya Wynn, senior practice manager for responsible Al, Machine Learning Solutions Lab, AWS, led an all-star discussion with top NGOs, leading startups and policymakers from 14 countries. Elsewhere, the Lisbon Council continued collaborating to create innovationoriented energy data spaces through **European Distributed Data Infrastructure for Energy (EDDIE)**, an 18-member consortium building an open-data framework for use and re-use of energy data to encourage more efficient consumption. The EDDIE project is co-financed by the European Union.

What's Next for the European Union

President Paul Hofheinz looks ahead at the coming challenges for the European Commission, particularly in the digital sphere. The policy brief will draw on a series of Lisbon Council workshops to be held throughout the year with an eye towards delivering an evidence-based, oven-ready roadmap for the incoming European Commission.





Green, Digital and Competitive: An SME Agenda for the 21st Century

As European SMEs gather in Bilbao for the SME Assembly, the Lisbon Council gears up for a new edition of **Green**, **Digital and Competitive: An SME Agenda for the 21st Century**. The policy brief will look more deeply at the factors and forces driving SME competitiveness in the European Union – and update country performance across key indicators. A companion policy brief will examine the policy challenges.

New Horizons

The Lisbon Council announces a new range of international consortia, all led by the Lisbon Council and co-financed by the European Union. Bridging the Gaps in Evidence, Regulation and Impact of Anticorruption Policies (BRIDGEGAP), a 15-member consortium from 11 countries, will produce a Transparency Index to inform policy and encourage effective action. Key partners include Center for the Study of Democracy, Transparency International and more. The Lisbon Council will also lead System Integration of Transformative Technical and Nature-Based Solutions to Improve Climate Neutrality of European Cities and Regions and Tackle Climate Change (URBREATH), a 37-partner consortium to develop a new strategy for regreening cities, and An Open and Co-Created Metaverse for Europe (OPENVERSE), a 12-partner, three-year project to scope, analyse and develop open standards for the metaverse.





Sustainable Computing and Data Centres: A New Approach

In cooperation with NVIDIA Corporation, the world's leading manufacturer of artificial intelligence-ready processing chips, the Lisbon Council launches a research project to develop new metrics and accurate modelling of energy consumption in the high-end computing sector. Researchers will dive deep on crucial questions, including energy-efficiency optimisation and raising Europe's performance in this area.
